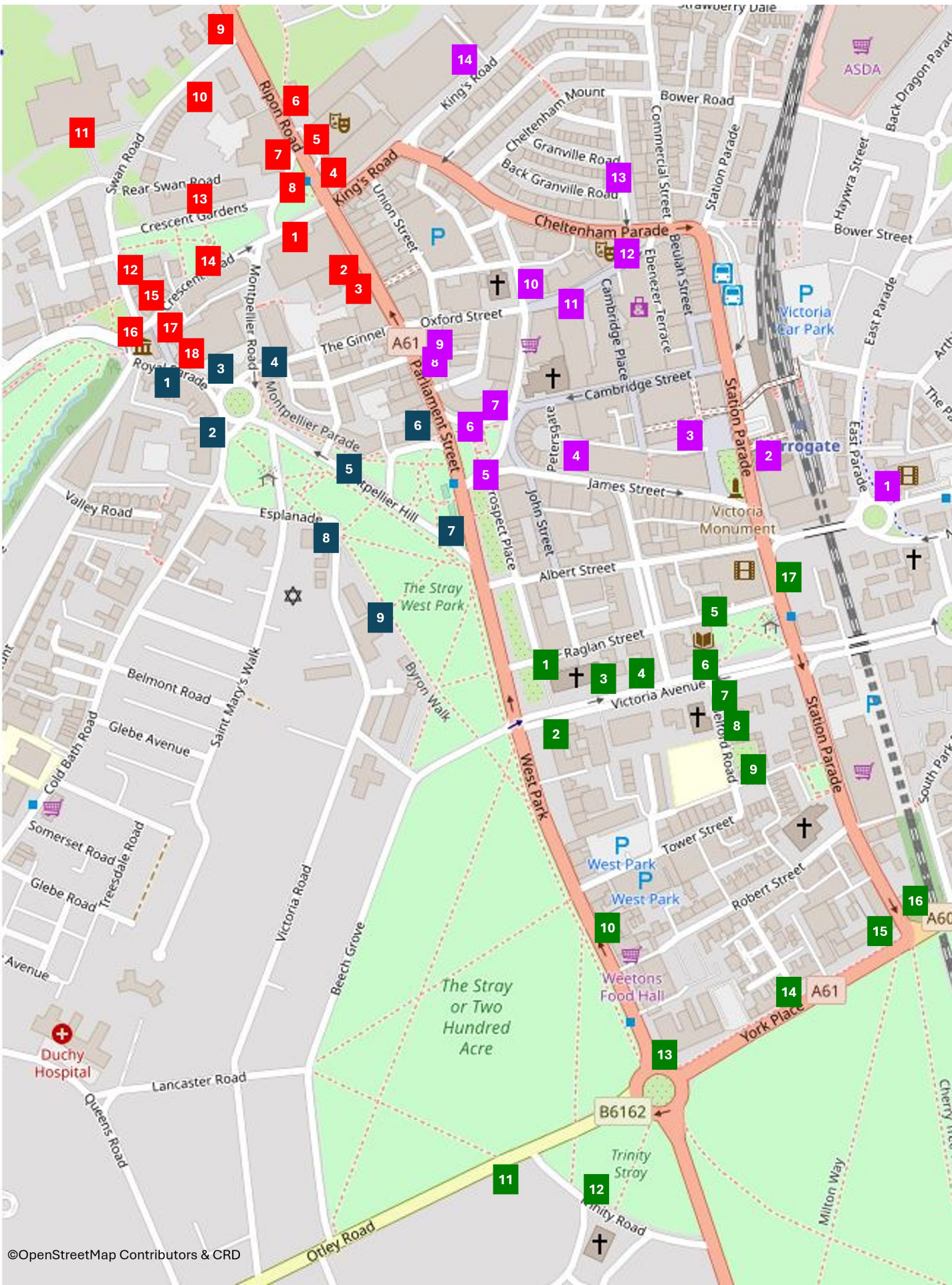

The four town centre trails can be walked individually. Together they form a circular trail, starting and ending at the Tourist Information Centre. In addition the Valley Gardens trail is close by. This provides an opportunity to view the famous gardens whilst also visiting the plaques.

- There are four Town Centre Trails and one close by in Valley Gardens.
- 1 Civic Trail (Red) - 18 plaques 0.7 mile, 1.1 km.
 - 2 Montpellier Trail (Blue) - 9 plaques 0.5 mile, 0.8 km.
 - 3 West Park Trail (Green) - 16 plaques 1.3 mile, 2.1 km.
 - 4 Victoria Trail (Purple) - 13 plaques 1.0 mile, 1.6 km.
 - 5 Valley Gardens Trail (Orange) - 12 plaques 0.8 mile, 1.3 km.

The Heritage Plaques

There are currently 94 Heritage Plaques in Harrogate, which have been installed over a period of 49 years.

Harrogate's heritage plaques are usually brown & rectangular in shape and tell the history of Harrogate.

Some plaques mark out significant historical buildings whilst others commemorate men and women who were instrumental in the development of the town or those whose businesses still play an active part in the town's fabric. Others commemorate famous people who have visited or had a connection with the town.

Many plaques have a connection with the town's Spa heritage.

Harrogate Civic Society has been, and still is, instrumental in having plaques created and installed, along with serving as a guardian of the town's heritage.
